



You probably noticed the temporary bracing on the awning

You probably noticed the temporary bracing on the awning in front of the Knights of Columbus Hall. It was damaged by a caterer several months back. We have settled with the insurance and are finally in the process of repairing the damaged awning. In the process of repairing, we will update the overhead lighting for both cosmetics and efficiency. We expect the awning to be fully repaired in November.

At November's Columbus Club meeting, the nominating committee will present three candidates to replace the three off-going board members. Then at the Council meeting, the three candidates will be presented to the members by the nominating committee. There will then be an Election by Acclamation, provided there are no floor nominations. If there are floor nominations, which will make the candidate total exceed the number of vacancies, there will then be a ballot vote. The top three candidates, with the most votes, will win the election to be on the Board.

A term on the Board consists of three years. A member can stay on the board for a second three-year term if he is voted in by the council, as described above. After two consecutive three-year terms, the member must be off the board for at least a year, before he can be elected again. If there are unscheduled vacancies on the board, the board members select a council member interested in joining the board. The selected member will serve out the time of the replaced member's term. A member's time served on a vacancy is on an interim basis. He can still serve two consecutive three-year terms immediately following the vacancy term.

The Columbus Club is seeking a Hall Manager to fulfill the duties of planning and estimating for hall events, managing the bar and employees, managing cleaning services and a host of other duties. If you or anyone you know are interested and need more information, please contact Dave Gall (current Hall Manager) or any of us on the Columbus Club.
