### FOOD PANTRY DONATION

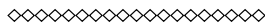

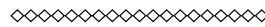
## KNIGHT OF THE YEAR:

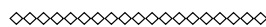

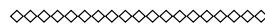
that we honor Senior Knight of the Month for December 2023 Vern Rakers. Congratulations from the Knights of Columbus Council # 1580.
