GRAND KNIGHT'S MESSAGE: JUNE 2024

Greeting's Brother Knights!

May is past, and June is upon us. Graduations have occurred, school is out, and the thoughts of vacations are in full bloom. Recently I attended the 126th Illinois State Council Knights of Columbus Convention in Chicago. This event brings Councils from across the state to meet and share ideas, make new friends, and to reinvigorate ourselves to get ready for the new year. Most Reverend Michael G. McGovern, Bishop of Belleville, spoke several times during the convention. This was the first time that I had heard him speak. His message was the importance of the Knights of Columbus, and the role that they play in the Church. He

also emphasized that we need to continue to pray for vocations, not only religious, but also the role of men as husbands and fathers.

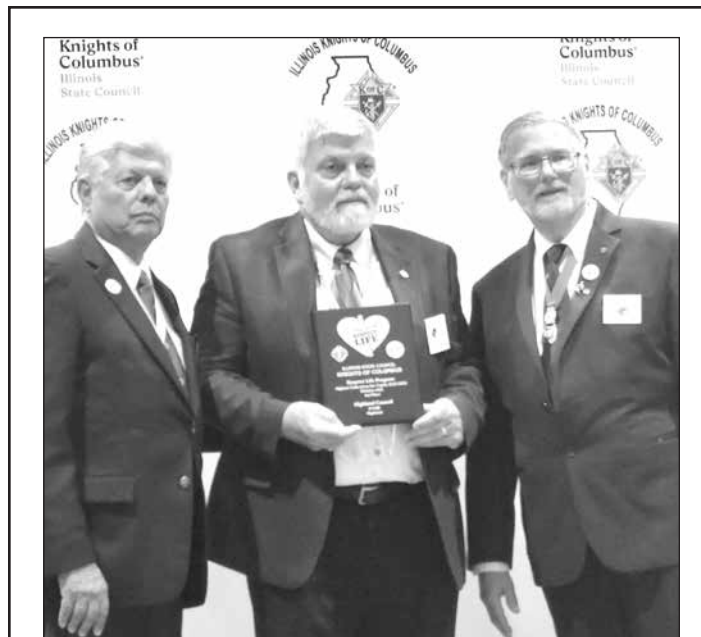
I had an opportunity to discuss with other Brother Knights the parish situations in their hometown areas. One, the parish that I formerly belonged to, just had a new pastor assigned to them after going a full year. This is a parish with over 2700 families. Another mentioned that their parish in Peru, Illinois was being consolidated with several other parishes. We have seen this occur in our area. The norm is becoming a priest being assigned two or three parishes. So, prayers for vocations are critical. On a different note, Fr. Charles Tuttle was recognized

for his fifty years of priesthood. Councils, as well as Brother Knights, are encouraged to send Fr. Tuttle congratulatory notes.

While I was in Chicago, we had two major events occur at our hall over the weekend. One was a fundraiser on Saturday evening. The comments coming back to me expressed gratefulness to the KC's for hosting this event. I understand that over six hundred people attended the event. The next day we hosted a chicken dinner. Although we were nowhere close to the attendance number of the night before, it was still a successful event. A big thank you goes out to the Brother Knights and the Ladies Auxiliary for helping with these events, as well as those who brought desserts for the dinner.

Finally, I did not come back from the convention empty handed. I know we do not look for accolades when we are performing our volunteer activities throughout the year, but sometimes they come back our way. This year we received five different awards for work done during the 2023-24 fraternal year. Our council is in the AAA division, which is for the largest councils in the state. We received third place awards for the Intellectual Disabilities category, the Respect Life category, and the General Assistance category. We received a second-place award in the Vocations category. Last of all we received a Silver Award for Illinois in Action. These awards are what you as a member of this council earned, and it could not have been done without your support. Congratulations to all of you on a job well done!

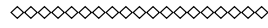

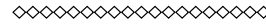

NEWS FROM THE FOURTH DEGREE

Who Are the Fourth Degree Knights?

They are the Knights on Main Street, the men you probably envision when someone says Knights of Columbus to you. They are present in their distinct uniform at civic and Church events, acting as honor guards, or standing in respect at the funerals of members or during adoration of the Eucharist. The Fourth Degree is the highest degree within the Knights of Columbus, and is an extension of the third degree. But there is more to being a Fourth-Degree member of the Knights of Columbus than a uniform. They are the men who have chosen to embrace the Order's

fourth principle of patriotism.

- To promote and strengthen the patriotic spirit of the civic community.
- To educate its members, and others, both in the teachings of Holy Mother Church, and the history of our nation.
- To promote by example the highest type of citizenship so necessary for the preservation of our democratic government.
- To oppose dissemination and spread of doctrine dangerous to our form of government, and to the Divine law of faith and morality.
- To support by word and deed, the duly constituted

authorities of local, state and national government, and to recognize excellence in public life.

Our Knights of Columbus Fourth Degree Assembly encompasses multiple towns. This fosters the ability to form larger honor guards and facilitate multi town events within a geographic region. Our local assembly includes the towns of Highland and Greenville IL. Upon death we honor our members with a ceremony and a chalice upon which their name is engraved. This chalice is given to their family. In due time, the chalice will be sent to a mission or given to a priest of choice. Wherever it goes, it will be used in the holy sacrifice of

the Mass, and there they will be remembered. And may its daily use rebound to their eternal glory.

Members who wish to live out patriotism together can join "the Fourth Degree". Members of this degree have the special honor of holding the title "Sir Knight", participating in honor guards, and organizing programs that promote Catholic Citizenship. 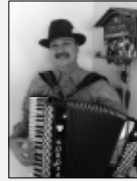
KNIGHTS ON THE TOWN
