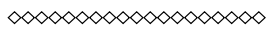

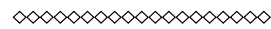


## KNIGHT OF THE MONTH:

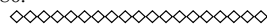

## SENIOR KNIGHT OF THE YEAR:

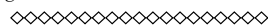

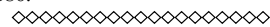

## FAMILY OF THE YEAR:

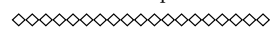
