Did you know that on Thursday, February 22, 1900, in honor of George Washington's birthday, the Knights of Columbus celebrated the first Exemplification of Patriotism? The ceremony was held in the Lennox Lyceum in New York City with 1,100 candidates in attendance. This was the beginning of the Fourth Degree of the Knights of Columbus. The quasquicentennial of this event occurred on February 22, 2025.

Who are the Fourth Degree?

They may be known by their distinct uniform, but there is more to being a Fourth Degree than what he wears. Men of the Fourth Degree have chosen to embrace patriotism and embody the fact that one can be a faithful Catholic and faithful citizen.

Fourth Degree Knights participate in patriotic programs and activities.

The Fourth Degree of the Knights of Columbus is available to all third degree members in good standing who are citizens of the country they reside and wish to grow in their practice of Catholic patriotism. One of the most important functions of the Fourth Degree is providing Guards of Honor at Mass, wakes, funerals, dedications and many other civic or patriotic functions. In their uniform, the Knights of Columbus are always recognized in any public appearance. These Sir Knights add dignity and a pride of church and country to any event. 
